Quorn Garden Club visit to Bradgate Park

Our band of intrepid gardeners gathered at the ruins in Bradgate Park and were led through an unremarkable gate set into the walls surrounding the house. What a sight greeted us! A cornucopia of colourful plants crammed into every nook and cranny with a delightful hum and buzz of insect and bird life all around. The garden has a very sheltered aspect being enclosed by two walls and receiving sun most of the day. The inner wall radiates back the heat it has taken up during the day to provide warmth long into the evening.

We were escorted around the garden by two of the twelve volunteers that tend the garden, Sarah, and Joelle. They told us about their work over the past five years reclaiming the beds of the former kitchen garden and planting out beds with vegetables and fruit. The long border following the inner wall is planted with hardy flowering perennials and shrubs and whilst we stood to admire the buddleia, we counted eight red admiral butterflies fluttering around from flowerhead to flowerhead. Both ladies were full of fascinating facts and clearly thoroughly enjoyed their time spent working in the garden. My favourite snippet was about Verbascum Bombiciferum and its many uses through time including the seed heads as torches / firelighters and apparently the leaves as "cowboy toilet paper".

The plants and seeds have been donated mostly by the volunteers and must be able to thrive in quite an arid environment. There was no water on site and containers had to be filled and carried across the park from the stream or café area. After a recent site visit by the Trustees a large tank has been provided but the filling of this is still somewhat of a trial. There are plans to continue filling in the gaps in the long border but the retaining wall is to be repointed in late summer / early autumn so this will be done afterwards. As with any garden there is always something needing doing!

The garden is open to the public on Sundays 12noon to 3pm. A £2 donation per person is collected by the Bradgate Park Trust.
